Frida

(*Frida: Natumleza Viva*)

Mexico, 1985, 107 mins.

In Spanish with English subtitles

André Breton called her "a bomb disguised as a butterfly." Frida Kahlo is one of Mexico's greatest painters, and surely one of the great women painters of all time. Married to Diego Rivera, an intimate of Trotsky-in-exile, Kahlo was a participant in Mexico's most committed and passionate period of cultural and political expression. The victim of a childhood spinal injury and countless operations, Kahlo translated to her canvases an interior world of constant physical pain and emotional anguish. Echoing the style of the muralists Kahlo knew so well, director Paul Leduc has created in *Frida* a mosaic-like portrait in which past and present, memories and dream images, the personal and the political combine to evoke the life of one of the most courageous artists of our time. As Frida Kahlo, Ofelia Medina brings an astounding physical resemblance to her role as well as consummate acting skills.

A Great Wall

U.S., 1985, 102 mins.

In English and Mandarin with English subtitles

The title takes its lead from Richard Nixon's famous one-liner on his first visit to China's most familiar landmark, "The great wall is a great wall." This is a clue to the wit and wry humor of this charming and utterly disarming first feature by Chinese-American director Peter Wang. Essentially a co-production between Chinese and American filmmakers, *A Great Wall* observes the reunion of a Chinese-American family from San Francisco with their relatives in Beijing after a 30-year separation. Sharply noting the comical aspects of cross-generational as well as cross-cultural conflicts, this charming film is especially revealing in its sequences dealing with the interplay of Chinese youths enamored with Western Culture and Americans looking for the traditional China. Well-paced and well-photographed, *A Great Wall* is more than a comedy in its observations on eternal human concerns.

Gwen

(*Gwen, le livre de sable*)

France, 1985, 67 mins.

In French with English subtitles

The richly detailed animation of this Annecy Grand Prize winner is very much in the tradition of Laguionie's mentor, Paul Grimault whose masterpiece, *The King and Mr. Bird*, thrilled viewers at our 1984 Festival.

Gwen takes place in some unspecified,



desolate future. Nomadic tribes have created their myths, but the young Gwen comes to challenge these, and to lead the aged Roseline on a pilgrimage across the dunes to examine the "City of the Dead" more closely. Elliptical, elusive, hard to pin down, *Gwen* is nevertheless utterly ravishing to the eye.
