

GREEK "NEW CINEMA" WINS A FIRST BATTLE

... The field was open for the best film of the festival, Roviros Manthoulis' "Face-to-Face"... It got the Prize for the best Direction and was crowned the moral winner of the festival by a young and enthusiastic audience. The film deserves to be studied and analysed for both its peculiar production method and its content and style. "Face-to-Face" is the confrontation of a young teacher of English by Athens bourgois society. He is hired to give English lessons to the young daughter of the family who does not stop teasing him and provoking him until he sleeps with her. The young man has every chance of settling in this convenient environment whose moral pretentions are nothing but a facade which covers a deeper amoralism in both love affairs and business. He will revolt at the last moment. The director has managed to avoid all caricature. His characters are not symbols of the absolute good or evil... A certain formalism, a curious mixture of Antonioni, for the film's flexible stylisation. and Godard, for its fragmentary narrative, keeps us constantly at a certain distance from the events and helps us to evade the danger of naturalism and didactism. The film is intelligent, vitriolic, a brilliant exercise. It may not be classified as an original work but for the Greek cinema it marks a date and perhaps its entrance to the international scene.
